Hello everyone!

'One step at a time', eh? That's the impact of this week's further easing of CIVID restrictions. For our Parish activity, we are now permitted to have 100 in our churches. (That's fewer than the overall maximum that was announced – because of the '4 square metre per person' rule and how that applies to the size of our churches.) See an attachment for the ways to book in for Masses (essential!) and to access Mass on TV and online.

For families and others, this easing of restrictions will give a lot of freedom of movement over the next two weeks: I hope you're able to have some enjoyable visits and entertainment to make the most of the extra choices that are becoming available.

The long reach of COVID-19 and the restrictions it has brought have impacted on the Plenary Council for the Catholic Church in Australia, announced several years ago now. You may remember that we wrote in suggestions for the Council to consider – about 1,400 Parishioners took that opportunity. We responded to the question 'what do you think God is asking of the Church in Australia at this time?'

The process of the Council was postponed, re-scheduled and then halted because of various lockdowns across the country – it is intended to be a forum for the whole of Australia. Behind the scenes the agenda for the Plenary Council has been prepared for when it is permitted – because of numbers - to gather. An attachment with this letter lays out that agenda. It is not the usual item-by-item list of matters: rather it is sixteen questions arranged under six headings: Conversion, Prayer, Formation, Structures, Governance, Institutions. The Council will employ the process of 'discernment', responding to the tens of thousands of responses of Parishioners and others. Some of this discernment has happened in identifying in the responses the headings and questions that make up the agenda.

Locally, this is the time of the year when the St Vincent de Paul Society asks for our support for their 'Winter Appeal'. We've had some chilly mornings this week: think of those who have 'slept rough' during it! Given that not many of us are allowed to gather and contribute directly to the Appeal, the Parish will make a donation to the Vinnies from your Thanksgiving contributions: we usually respond quite generously.

In this weekend's Readings the compassion of God, shown so often in Jesus' actions, reaches out to people who have been brought low, 'that they may have life'. An article in another attachment is from the Far East magazine and translates that into 'kindness', bidding us to reach to relate with others with that feeling of God's for all creation: "to be kind to the people we work with and all others in our world is to be missionary".

The two weeks of school holidays starting this weekend usually give many of us a chance for some 'easy time'. Take that opportunity when it comes your way! Blessings. Keep safe and warm and well and hopeful! Make the most of this next easing of the restrictions.
