Hello everyone!

During this week it was the turn of our young Parishioners from our Sacred Heart School to gather for their first experience of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. They knew it all:

Who is the most important person in the Sacrament of Reconciliation? God.

Why is God the most important person in the Sacrament of Reconciliation? *Because God forgives us.* Why does God forgive us? *Because God loves us.*

Oh, we hope and pray that they and their families keep strong in that awareness throughout their lives!

When I asked these young Parishioners to name some of their feelings having shared in the forgiveness of God, one word was 'fresh'.

We are all called to something of that in the Season of Advent, I think, a 'freshness' in our faith. After all, it is the beginning of a 'new year' for the Church, for people of Christian faith. And it's fitting as we move out of the year of those h-e-a-v-y lockdowns and continuing restrictions for us to look for 'renewal' in our lives.

I think of the word 'revolution' in this Season. One way to read that word is about something that goes around in a circle back to where it began. A second way is to read the word as changing the current situation and introducing something new.

There's both of those senses in our coming to and coming through Advent each year. The Season refocusses us on the continuing centre of our faith – the love of God shown in the birth of Jesus, Son of God, into our human experience. After everything else that has happened during the year, we come back to that heart of our faith.

And the Season calls us to review the ways we are people of faith, and to be people of faith in new ways in the new year. It is this second understanding that John the Baptist directly advises the people to take up in this weekend's Gospel Reading: change, be different, be new – and show it!

The opportunity to gather for this type of re-focussing and renewal comes during next week in our two services of **"ADVENT PRAYER AND RECONCILIATION"**

on Wednesday 15th December at 7.30pm in Emmaus church

and on Thursday 16th December at 7.30pm in Sacred Heart church

These Prayer Services will be followed by the opportunity for the Sacrament of Penance (First Rite). Consider including this in your Advent re-awareness!

Advent relieves us of our commitment to the frenetic in a fast-paced world. It slows us down.

It makes us think. It makes us look beyond today to the "great tomorrow" of life. Without Advent, moved only by the race to nowhere that exhausts the world around us, we could be so frantic with trying to consume and control this life that we fail to develop within ourselves a taste for the spirit that does not die and will not slip through our fingers like melted snow.

It is while waiting for the coming of the reign of God, Advent after Advent, that we come to realise that its coming depends on us.

What we do will either hasten or slow, sharpen or dim our own commitment to doour part to bring it.(Joan Chittester (Ancient Practices 62)
