Mary Mackillop - 1842-1909

Mary Helen MacKillop was born in Fitzroy, Victoria, Australia on 15 January 1842 the eldest of 8 children of Flora MacDonald and Alexander MacKillop, immigrants from Scotland. When Mary was young financial difficulties caused the family to lose their home and to become dependent on relatives. Although destitution was traumatic, through her mother's influence Mary learned to depend on the providence of God. When she was 14 she went to work to contribute to her family's financial support. She became a teacher which stood her in good stead throughout her life.

In 1866, when Mary was 24, she founded with Father Julian Tenison Woods, a group of Sisters in Penola, South Australia. The group grew into the Congregation of the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart. The founders' vision was for groups of two or three Sisters to go into the outback and to provide bush schools and education in faith for the children. Many women joined Mary and soon the Sisters were teaching as well as caring for orphans and homeless people. Mary's name as a Sister was, Mary of the Cross.

Mary was an inspirational woman both in

the Church and in society. She was forthright, practical, loving, simple and faithful. At times when she experienced rejection, libel, excommunication and removal from leadership of the congregation, she responded with goodness. The quality of her dependence on the providence of God shone through and she manifested an heroic ability to forgive deeply. She and her Sisters focussed on their ministry for the poor and on God's love of them and Mary never let what people thought about her stop her. She sought help for her work from like-minded people and counted as her supporters Catholic, lewish as well as Protestant friends.

After suffering the effects of a stroke Mary died in Alma Cottage in Mary MacKillop Place, North Sydney on 8th August 1909. Her tomb is in the Memorial Chapel at Mary MacKillop Place. Special Masses are celebrated there for pilgrims on the 8th of each month and on Mary's feast day, 8th August each year.

Mary was beatified by Pope John Paul II in Sydney in 1995 and canonised by Pope Benedict XVI in Rome on 17th October 2010.
