## Safety of our children

The safety of our children is extremely important to us at Emmaus. In the mornings the gates are open at 8.30 and the children are then supervised by teachers on duty until the bell goes at 8.45. At the end of the day the children are supervised until parents pick their children up.



### Parent responsibility before and after school

We love having parents chatting in the piazza after school with their children playing around them, in the trees and on the playground. When parents pick their children up after school they are responsible for their child's safety. If your children are on the playground, parents must supervise them. If the children are climbing trees or playing on the asphalt, parents need to be responsible for them. Teachers often have meetings they need to hurry to after school and cannot supervise the children at this time of the day. Parents are also responsible for supervising preschool children before and after school. Thank you for partnering with us for the care and safety of the children at Emmaus.
