Dear Families,

### **Carpark Safety**

Parents can not drop their children onto the street for them to walk into school on their own. Children need to walk with a parent through the carpark. Parents wanting to drop their children off in the car park to walk into school need to use the 'kiss and drop' where we have Michael rostered to open car doors and ensure children walk into school safely.

## **Parking on Pecks Road**

A parent recently told me they received a parking ticket on Pecks Road. I have spoken with the council. Parents can NEVER park in a "No Standing" area. Parents can park very briefly to drop off or pick up a child where the sign indicates "No Parking". Parents cannot leave their car if they are parked near these signs. It is always best to try and park where the sign indicates you can.

This year we will be holding the concert in the hall at CRC North Keilor as the CRC Sydenham hall is still being constructed.
